e.g. A dog, a book, etc. AN is used when a noun starts with a vowel sound; e.g. An apple, an bour, etc.

We use SOME with countable nouns (only with their plural) and with uncountable nouns. SOME is used in:

- * positive sentences;
- e.g. I have got some time.
- * questions, expressing requests and

E.g. Would you like some tea?

Can I have some biscuits?

We use ANY with countable nouns (only with their plural) and with uncountable nouns. ANY is used in:

- * negative sentences;
- e.g. I haven't got any time.
- * general questions;
- e.g. Have you got any sisters? Is there any tea left?
