We can use the **past simple** to talk about things we did in the past. The past simple ending is -ed for regular verbs:

play – play**ed**, watch – watch**ed**, want – want**ed**Irregular verbs have a special form:

eat – **ate**, write – **wrote**, go – **went**For the negative, don't change the main verb. Use 'didn't' instead:
play – **didn't** play, eat – **didn't** eat

Examples

I **played** football. We **ate** lots of cake! She **didn't watch** a film.

Remember!

For regular verbs, we add -ed. For irregular verbs, there is a special past tense form. regular: play - played, watch - watched, want - wanted irregular: eat - ate, write - wrote, go - went

Be careful!

When we use the negative, we don't change the main verb. We use 'didn't' instead.

I didn't watch TV.
I didn't go to school.
