About Hong Kong

- Hong Kong is one of China's two **Special Administrative Regions**, meaning that they have a high degree of autonomy (self-governing powers).
- Hong Kong became a British colony in 1842, but was returned to China in 1997.
- Hong Kong consists of three parts: **Hong Kong Island, Kowloon**, and the **New Territories** (which include more than 200 islands)!



More Facts!



- Hong Kong has one of the greatest population densities in the world, at about 6,700 people per square kilometer.
- The territory has a population of approximately 7.4 million people. Most are ethnically Chinese and the most common language is Cantonese. Many people also learn English and Mandarin.
