- There is a car → Hay un coche.
- There are two cars → Hay dos coches
- There is some money → Hay algo de dinero.

* Negativa (contables e incontables)

- There isn't any car. (No hay ningún coche)
- There aren't any cars. (No hay ningunos coches)

* Interrogativa

- Is there any car? (¿Hay algún coche?)
- Are there any cars? (¿Hay algunos coches?)

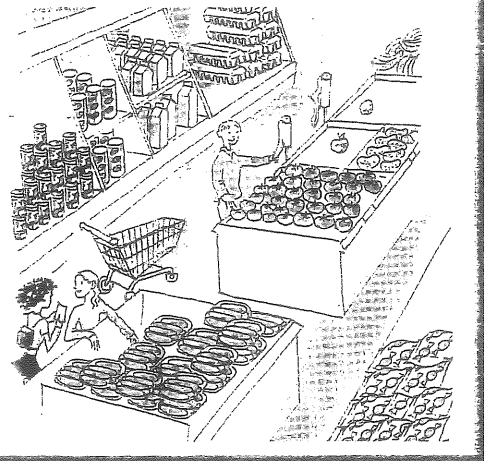

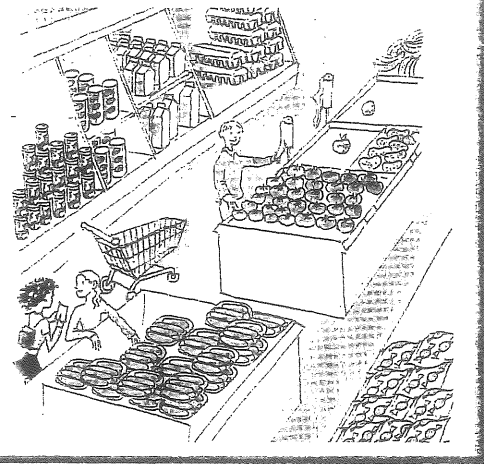
